



How are your student services staff members communicating with parents and students? (39 responses)

We are attempting to do the same things we would be doing during the normal school day. We have sent out grade level letters directly from counselors to have some sort of contact with every student on their caseload.

We have created google classrooms by grade level to share resources, make announcements, assign Naviance tasks, deliver our large group SEL based curriculum, and run prevention/awareness activities. We still hold weekly dept meetings and MTSS meetings. Interventions are being provided on Wednesdays via zoom, as they are no new content days for classes.

Despite emailing every student on our caseloads, we get minimal responses. We did send out a needs assessment which about 100 students responded to, half of them said they were ok, half said they wanted their counselor to reach out to them. Students are focused on balancing home life distractions and fitting in the navigation of remote learning. Some are resistant to communicating with counselors by google meet saying it's "weird". One counselor had to contact DCFS because a student reported a situation at home.

We are still adjusting and learning how to manage this and create connections and services.

Next week we will also be sending out resources to seniors and juniors. Once the resources are out counselors will be available to meet virtually with students on post high school planning and questions etc...

We are starting to look at how to handle crisis team issues virtually as a result of resent student events and several parents or family members effected by Covid19

Students are reluctant to participate, but the Counselors are being proactive and continuing to contact. They are part of the team who is reaching out to those who are not engaging in remote learning.

all of our counselors made google classrooms to disseminate information


We are limited as we don't want to overload students. We posted resources on the school's e-learning webpage.

We are also discussing a "drive through" graduation in our parking lot.


We are still keeping a July in person graduation on the books. But most planning is towards making a streamed graduation special.

We use Skyward to send out regular messages to parents and students' emails with resources to help with academics, post-secondary planning and social emotional supports

We sent a google "check in" form to all of our students to determine how they are feeling and what assistance they need. We will continue to attempt to reach out to those we do not hear from.

We have sent out senior survey via email and posted on Canvas site.

We have not discussed this as of yet.

We are trying to create a form that will allow us to determine their needs.

We are reaching out to all seniors via email and phone to help guide them through the last stage of post-secondary planning.

We are holding a Google Hangout for all seniors to connect and provide us feedback on how we can make their last quarter special. We will do a virtual Decision day on our Insta page.

We are available to meet/talk virtually. We are also trying to push out current information for seniors and parents.

Virtual meetings and emails

Very individualized, but supporting in whatever way we can and connecting students to college reps as applicable.

Toward the end of April and into May (once resources go out next week), counselors and college counselor will be available to support students via phone, email or virtual meetings.

The vast majority can be accomplished remotely--via Naviance and Google Hangouts/Zoom

The D214 Postsecondary counselors invited reps from our top 10 schools to Zoom and answer questions. They have office hours, etc. We will survey students.

Student initiated. We will do one on one assistance with them via Google Meet, phone calls, and emails. We are also going through Naviance to see which students haven't applied to a college and contacting each of them and if they are community college bound, setting them up with a virtual enrollment session that we will be offering for WCC.

Sharing information and resources through email updates, our department website, and social media. Counselors have been continuing to help seniors with specific post-secondary concerns through email, phone, or video meeting.

Our CRC has been busy pushing out surveys to see what seniors need and set up times to meet with them.

Our College Counselors will be available for virtual meetings with seniors.

Our College and Career Center is providing regular emails and guidance as virtual resources are available.

One at a time. Our college counselor and assistant have done a fantastic job of updating our families regularly. Generalist counselors are supporting students as well. We also use Naviance to track final plans and can reach out individually to students who have not completed that step.

Most of them have signed up for the Senior Advisory Google classroom where one of our counselors regularly posts updates on college/financial aid topics, scholarship opportunities and other announcements. Other than that, we are currently reaching out by email to each individual senior

Groups have been created in Schoology in order to hold conferences and/or communicate/share information and our college and career advisors are holding virtual office hours.

Group guidance activity and individual outreach, weekly emails

Google Meet video calls and Virtual Decision Day celebration

Facilitate Zoom sessions that address common topics (award letter breakdowns; making decisions/delaying decisions; financial aid requests)

Counselor appointments via phone, video chat, email correspondence.

Continue contact and perform typical tasks remotely until further notice.

At this point students are working through their counselors individually.

The district is investigating a multi-disciplinary team (coun, sw, admin, teachers) to research and consider ways to support students as they transition back to school next year.

We are already putting plans in place to meet the significant needs post trauma. Given the varying levels of trauma exposure and trauma history, students and staff will have tangible needs that will be addressed in the school setting. We will probably start the year in "Crisis Response" and perform periodic needs assessments with staff, students, and parents to ensure we are aware of how we need to flex our services. We are also planning to connect with our community resources as well when the school year begins in more strategic was based on the level of crisis response.

We are focused on the remainder of the year at this point and will discuss fall at a later time.

We are going to start the year with a strong sel and community building initiative but we don't know what that is yet.

We are in early discussion but too early to determine

We are meeting as a crisis team to discuss virtual crisis supports in the event we have a covid 19th death in the community.

We are planning on needing more truama groups and more grief groups. We're hoping to lessen some of the bureaucratic responsibilities on counselors and social workers to allow them to deal with a larger flow of student support.

We have a COVID-19 group going now. Designed for kids effected by loss of family members or parents out of work. Or just upset in general.

We will have to adjust based on the current situation but I am not yet sure what exactly that will look like.

Will definitely plan for some type of well being activity, lesson, etc. Something prior to instruction beginning.

Other comments, concerns, ideas for the group:

How are other districts handling Semester 1 incompletes and requests for semester 2 Pass/Fail grades? How will you handle seniors who are failing?

Might be beneficial to have a July Zoom/virtual meeting for us all to discuss Fall opening of school.

Reach out to the DOC Board and other colleagues. Everyone is willing to consult and help as we plan for an experience unknown to each other.
